#### Introducing the Proposed "One Board" Leadership Structure

Dear Church Family,

Grace and peace! In the midst of changing times, I am writing to let you know about a proposed modification to the leadership structure of our local church.

LUMC has always organized its leadership according to a traditional United Methodist Church leadership structure, as laid out in the *United Methodist Book of Discipline*. This traditional structure provides that the highest decision-making body in the local church is the Church Conference (which meets at least once annually—usually in the fall—and is comprised of all professing church members). The traditional structure delegates ongoing leadership, decision-making, and administration during the year to the following committees: 1) the Church Council, 2) the Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC), 3) the Finance Committee, and 4) the Board of Trustees. (LUMC has created many additional committees to provide for our robust mission and ministry efforts, but the above four are required under the traditional leadership structure.)

Beginning in 2016, the *United Methodist Book of Discipline* introduced a new, alternative leadership structure, known as the Simplified Accountable Leadership Structure (or, for short, the "One Board" model). The One Board model maintains the Church Conference as the highest decision-making body in the local church, but then combines the subsequent four primary leadership committees into one leadership board. The purpose of this simplification is for the local church to spend less time and energy on meetings and administrative functioning, so that it can spend more time and energy on fulfilling its mission (making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world!). The One Board model has been in use in United Methodist Churches across our global connection since 2011 and officially approved since 2016. Since that time, the One Board model has been adopted and successfully used by a growing number of local churches in the denomination, including a significant proportion of local churches in the New England Annual Conference.

In the spring of this year, following an eight-week mission and ministry discernment process, the Church Council unanimously voted to ask the Nominations Committee to prepare its leadership nominations for 2026 according to the One Board model. Therefore, when the Nominations Report is released in the coming weeks, you will see one that we have nominated one leadership board that will function as Church Council, SPRC, Finance Committee, and Trustees. All professing church members will have the opportunity to vote on these nominations per the proposed change in leadership at our upcoming Church Conference on November 2, 2025.

Following the release of the Nominations Report, I will be holding two listening sessions for the purpose of answering questions and receiving feedback on this proposal. These listening sessions are open to all and will be held after church, in the Sanctuary, on Sunday, October 19 and Sunday, October 26. Please come with any questions, concerns, or feedback you may have so that you will be prepared to vote at the Church Conference on Sunday, November 2.



The Closet is open to Food Pantry Clients on the 4th Saturday of the month. They may leave a donation for the Clothing to assist those in transitional housing.




Join us Sunday mornings for worship service at 9:30 am.
